DAAA Solicits Comments on FY 2027 – FY 2029 Multi-Year Plan for Seniors

(Detroit) The Detroit Area Agency on Aging (DAAA) is hosting a Public Hearing for its proposed FY 2027- FY 2029 Multi-Year Plan on Wednesday, June 3, 2026, 10:00AM - 12:00PM. Seniors, Caregivers, Adults with Disabilities, Service Providers, Elected Officials, and the Public are Invited to comment on the draft plan through oral or written testimony through June 19, 2026.

Every three years, the Michigan Bureau of Aging, Community Living, and Supports (ACLS Bureau - formerly Aging and Adult Services Agency) requires the 16 Area Agencies on Aging (AAAs) in Michigan under its auspices to develop a plan that will cover expected spending over the three-year period for older adult services. This year, the State Unit on Aging requests AAAs to develop a FY 2027- FY29 Multi-Year Plan to outline how services will be delivered from October 1, 2026, through September 30, 2029. This plan outlines services to be funded over each fiscal year that help older adults age in their homes and communities.

The DAAA was founded in 1980 as a private, non-profit agency established to provide services to 60-plus older adults in the City of Detroit and its central and eastern suburbs: Highland Park, Hamtramck, the five Grosse Pointes, and Harper Woods. Since that time, its constituents have grown to include 18-plus adults with disabilities, veterans, and family caregivers. DAAA's service area consists of about 300,000 individuals inclusive of 154,435 older people aged 60 years and over.

The proposed FY 2027- FY 2029 Multi-Year Plan will be available for review on 5/19/2026 with the deadline for comments to be submitted by June 19, 2026, for the public. The services to be funded for older adults and caregivers with federal and state funding. proposed plan outlines
